SSG Diana Powers

Staff Sergeant Diana Powers, from Shelby, Ohio, joined the West Point Band as piccoloist and the West Point Woodwind Quintet as flutist in 2006. She previously served as principal flute with The United States Army Field Band at Fort Meade, Maryland, appearing as flute and piccolo soloist with the Field Band on five national concert tours. She has been a featured soloist at the Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic in Chicago, the Ohio Music Educators Association Conference and the National Flute Association Convention in Washington, D.C. SSG Powers currently performs with Albany Symphony, Springfield Symphony, Waterbury Symphony, and Hudson Valley Philharmonic, and has been the piccolo soloist of Keith Brion's New Sousa Band since 1997. She received music degrees from The Ohio State University and the Longy School of Music, studying with Katherine Borst Jones and Robert Willoughby.

SSG Torin Olsen

Staff Sergeant Torin Olsen joined the West Point Band in April of 2010. In 2001, he received his Bachelor of Music from the University of Southern California where he studied with Jim Walker, an alumnus of the West Point Band. Prior to earning his Master of Music from Duquesne University under the tutelage of Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra flutist Damian Bursill-Hall in 2006, he studied under Robert Langevin and Geralyn Coticone. Before arriving at West Point, SSG Olsen performed with the Warren Philharmonic, Johnstown Symphony Orchestra, Erie Philharmonic, W.D. Packard Concert Band, and McKeesport Symphony Orchestra. He gave the world premier of Todd Goodman's *Echos*, a concerto for piccolo and orchestra, with the McKeesport Symphony in 2007. An avid chamber musician, SSG Olsen was a founding member of Zephyrs, a Pittsburgh based woodwind quintet, and along with his flutist wife, Brianne, formed the chamber group "The Olsen Duo."

Louis Carlini

Louis Carlini is not only an expert flute repairman, but also a Straubinger Certified Technician. Lou acquired most of his expertise from working with his Dad, a master machinist and tool and die maker who had studied instrument repair at the Dorn & Kirchner School in Union NJ. In 1973 they began to specialize in professional quality flutes, and by 1992, Lou was working on the flute of Julius Baker, former Principal of the NY Philharmonic. Manufacturers in the quiet evolution of flutemaking in the generation of the Golden Era through today have depended on his expert opinion, and Louis continues to troubleshoot and apply his ingenuity to each flute's individual needs and capacities.

Mr. Carlini holds degrees in English Literature from FDU and Music Performance [Magna Cum Laude] from Rutgers University. He studied flute with Anton Kuskin and Ransom Wilson. He has conducted repair seminars at Wilkes University [Pa.] and at the 1998 NY Flute Fair, and has done flute triage both at Wilkes and for Julius Baker master classes.

From Garden State Parkway Northbound

- 1. Use Exit 172 Montvale (the last exit in New Jersey)
- 2. Bear right at the exit onto West Grand Avenue
- 3. Drive past 3 traffic lights, traveling 1.6 miles to Woodland Road (old stone church on the far left corner)
- 4. Turn left onto Woodland Road and take the first left up the hill to St. Paul's.

From New York State Thruway

- 1. Use Exit 14 A Garden State Parkway / New Jersey
- 2. Take the Parkway to Schoolhouse Road / Chestnut Ridge exit.
- 3. Turn left onto Schoolhouse Road (which becomes Spring Valley Road after crossing the NJ state line.
- 4. Proceed 1.5 miles to second traffic signal.
- 5. Turn left onto West Grand Avenue, proceed 8/10ths of a mile to Woodland Rd.
- 6. Turn left onto Woodland Rd. and left up the hill to St. Paul's.

From Palisades Interstate Parkway

- 1. Use Exit 6W Orangeburg Road, Pearl River
- 2. Travel west on Orangeburg Road, about 2 miles to the fourth traffic light (reservoir on left, golf course on right)
- **3.** Turn left onto S. Blue Hill Road. Go 6/10ths of a mile and bear right onto Rte 2, Blue Hill Road. Take to stop sign.
- 4. Turn right onto River Vale Road, then take quick left onto E. Grand Avenue
- **5.** Continue on E. Grand Ave. (becomes W. Grand after crossing the railroad tracks) for 1.3 miles to old stone church building on right corner.
- 6. Turn right onto Woodland Road and first left up the hill to St. Paul's.
